Intent:

The intent of the Pupil Premium Strategy is to allow all disadvantaged pupils to make progress and to ensure they have greater successes in life. We consider the importance of 'excellence' and 'equity' in our school approach.

Excellence – Providing an outstanding network of teaching and learning through a robust and ambitious curriculum. This is accessed by all pupils, regardless of their attainment or current progress levels.

Equity – The use of funding allows disadvantaged children to access the same opportunities, experiences, and support as those who are described as non-disadvantaged.

Implementation:

Please find attached analysis and measures that have taken place to support our work towards the Pupil Premium Strategy:

- An identified pupil premium governor is appointed to seek assurance that pupil premium funding is appropriately used.
- Identified Pupil premium leader to ensure that pupils who are eligible for Pupil premium can access the relevant support.
- Identified Designated teacher of Children in Care ensures that these pupils are provided with the necessary support in line with the Child in Care policy.
- Pupil premium administrator ensures that the PP register is kept up to date and where necessary HAF vouchers are sent to identified families.
- Pupil Premium leader works with Headteacher to develop the Pupil Premium Strategy for 2023/24.
 They refer to DfE guidance and the Education Endowment Fund (EEF) for strategies that can be included.
- Pupil premium leader works alongside senior leaders to create a provision map Interventions and therapies for pupils to access.
- Pupil premium leader works with colleagues to evaluate the impact of all interventions and therapies.

A large aspect of our pupil premium strategy is to ensure that pupils have access to a range of professional and in school trained staff who can support them with any need. Please see below the current additional staffing that supports the delivery of interventions and therapies.
