<p>Austen: Entry Level 1: Reading and Writing: Pupils will look at being able to follow instructions which are written down and ones which are said to them. The pupils will have an introduction to writing skills with a focus on the correct usage of proper nouns and the correct punctuation for a complete, simple sentence.</p> <p>Entry Level 2: Reading and Writing: Pupils will be focusing on reading and understanding descriptions. Within their writing they will be focusing on spelling, punctuation and grammar: plurals, prefixes and suffixes.</p> <p>Entry Level 3: Reading and Writing: Pupils will be able to read and understand descriptions. Pupils will understand a subject - Verb agreement and be able to use the correct plurals. They will learn how to be consistent in the use of tenses and be able to use their knowledge of the alphabet to sequence words and use a dictionary correctly.</p> <p>Kinney: Entry level 3: Reading / Writing: The pupils will extract the main points of a text and develop their retrieval and inference skills. Pupils will use mostly correct grammar by using the correct subject-verb agreement. Pupils will use the correct tense in their writing.</p> <p>Angelou: FS Level 1: Reading / Writing: Pupils will explore the features of different types of texts, including newspapers</p>	<p>Austen: Entry Level 1: The 4 Operations: Pupils will be using their number bonds to 10 to answer addition questions, they will be adding numbers within 50. Pupils will learn how to add 1 digit by 1 digit by 1 digit, and they will learn how to double numbers.</p> <p>Entry Level 2: The 4 Operations: Pupils will use number bonds to add numbers to 100 using a number line and jumping. They will learn how to double and be confident with the 3,4 and 8 times table.</p> <p>Kinney: Entry Level 3: The 4 Operations: Pupils will learn how to apply different strategies to add and subtract numbers up to 4 digits. Pupils will develop their understanding of multiplication and division and apply these in both informal and formal written methods. Pupils will their multiplication knowledge to explore prime, square and cube numbers.</p> <p>Angelou: Entry Level 3: The 4 Operations: The pupils will understand the 4 operations in maths, using traditional written methods and mental maths. They will understand the order of operations and understand the qualities of numbers.</p> <p>FS Level 1 & 2: The 4 Operations: The pupils will be able to add and subtract integers and decimals and recognise the order of operations. They will learn how to recognise and work with standard form and will recognise the qualities of different numbers. They will look at sequences and be able to work out how to find the nth term of a given sequence</p>	<p>Austen: WJEC Entry 2: Variation and adaptation: Pupils will learn about the different environments and habitats of different organisms, and how humans affect them. They will also learn about adaptations that have been made and why.</p> <p>Kinney: WJEC Entry 2: Working with Electrical Circuits: Pupils will be able to identify the components used in simple electrical circuits. Pupils will start to develop an understanding of how energy changes in an electrical circuit. Pupils will consider how to stay safe when using electricity. Pupils will learn how to build simple circuits safely.</p> <p>WJEC Entry 3: Working with Electrical Circuits: Pupils will be able to identify the components used in simple circuit diagrams. Pupils will describe the energy transfer that takes place in circuits. Pupils will learn about safe working practices around electricity and explain how the risks can be reduced. Pupils will create simple circuits and measure current and voltage.</p> <p>Angelou: FS Level 1 / GCSE: Biology: Pupils will learn about specialised cells in the nervous system.</p> <p>Chemistry: Pupils will learn that bonds are forces of attraction that hold atoms together. They will learn about the three different types of bonding, ionic, covalent and metallic.</p>
